### "The Crescent"

#### Key unique elements:

- Curved circulation path connects School and Public program elements, creating a Community Commons at the center of the site
- Community Commons is located above street level
- Teaching Theater is accessible from Community Commons
- Community / School Library occupies the center of the School program, opens onto public plaza at 53rd and San Pablo
- Community Multi-Purpose space anchors corner of 47th and San Pablo








# "The Loop"

#### Key unique elements:


- Circulation connects School functions on 2nd floor, overlooking Community Commons at ground level
- Public program elements surround Community Commons at ground level, as well as on San Pablo frontage
- School and Community functions distributed evenly around perimeter of site
- E-W field orientation provides space for a linear Park, connecting Community Commons to greenway





# Each of these options...

- Keeps and Renovates the existing Gym / Pool Complex
- Adds a new community Gym and Athletic Facility next to the existing Gym
- Provides K-8 Drop-off along 53<sup>rd</sup> Street
- Provides On-Site Structured Parking (Not Underground)
- Contain about 150,000 square feet of building floor area
- Create a public park (Temescal Creek Plaza) at corner of 53rd Street and San Pablo
- Avoids building over the Temescal Creek culvert
- Locates Parking and Service access from 47<sup>th</sup> street
- Cost the same amount
